Assignment

This assignment is a group presentation project in which you will work in small groups of 3-4 to introduce a particular type of research to the class. Your presentation should include: (1) a basic overview, (2) who uses the methods and where they are used, (3) what types of instruments are used, and (4) how this type of research is reported. Your presentation must also include samples for the class. Your goal with this presentation is to help the class understand this method so that they can use it for the activity we will start following your presentation.

What should the Research Method Presentation do?

Your presentation should:

- Inform the class about the basics of this type of research
 - Who developed this method? Where did it come from?
 - What terms do we need to know to understand this method? (Population, sample, variable, etc.)
 - o Who uses this method? (Scientists, doctors, professors, marketers, etc.)
 - Where is it used? (Labs, schools, corporations, etc.)
- Explain the types of instruments used in this type of research
 - How do they work?
 - What kind of data do they collect?
 - What do they look like?
 - Are there "rules" for design?
 - How reliable is this method?
- Explain the most common ways data is analyzed and reported
 - How do researchers make sense of their data?
 - What "rules" do they take into account?
 - What types of data are most commonly reported?
 - What format does the data take?
 - o How do researchers report reliability, validity, and replicability?
 - How is the data presented in research reports?
- Show samples of both the research instruments and research reporting
- Provide a list of at least 7 *reliable* sources (cited in APA format) that someone could use if he/she was interested in using this method in his/her portfolio project on the handout

What should the Research Method Presentation look like?

You are expected to take between 15-20 minutes to make your presentation. You have lots to cover and you need to cover it clearly and relatively quickly. For planning purposes, 10-15 text-based PowerPoint slides will take most, if not all, of the time.

I have provided you with some "starting point" resources in Moodle, but you are expected to go beyond those resources and do outside research. You also have access to the Research Methods Library Guide here: http://libguides.trine.edu/methods.

Your presentation should include a visual component and a handout. You are welcome to use the computer in the classroom or to bring in your own if it is HDMI compatible. You are also welcome to being in artifacts, images, etc.

Assessment

This assignment is worth 50 points. The following rubric will be used to assess your presentation. After the facilitation, you will each fill out a Group Assessment Form that will allow you to let me know your role in the facilitation and how the group worked as a whole. I will then assign a grade to each group member, based on my observations and the Group Assessment reports. Groups will also receive feedback from me.
