WHAT IS A RESEARCH PRESENTATION?

A research presentation is a brief explanation of your research made to colleagues, and generally followed by a question and answer session. The purposes of the presentation are (1) to share the knowledge you've gained from your research and (2) to receive feedback from your peers on your research.

Research presentations are generally made at professional conferences where many other people are speaking about a related topic. You will generally be part of a panel where 2-3 other people speak about their research, which is similar or related to your research.

THE ASSIGNMENT

You need to prepare a 9-10 minute presentation, based on the proposal that you submitted for the Undergraduate Research Conference, that identifies your research questions and explains your project, describes your research methods, details your findings, and presents the conclusions you've drawn and what people in the audience can learn from those conclusions.

Your presentations should also be accompanied by a multi-media element and a handout. The multimedia element should be integrated into your presentation and add to what you are saying—not simply replicate it. Your handout should include elements you want people to be able to see throughout your presentation, such as data or sets of practices you would like people to use in their daily lives or workplaces. It should also include your presentation title and your contact information.

Presentations will be followed by a short question and answer session. You need to be prepared to answer questions from both your peers and from me.

Dress for the presentation is professional.
