# **Sports, Entertainment & Technology**

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#### WHAT IS VISUAL ARGUMENT?

You're probably more familiar with visual argument than you think. Visual argument is the practice of using images to present an idea or point of view. It relies on using images that people recognize and associate particular messages with in new or unique ways to make a point. Common places you've probably seen visual arguments are memes and public service announcements.

This project asks you to take the topic you chose for your Sports, Entertainment & Technology paper and present it as a visual argument. Your goal is to show the typical presentation of your topic and how that topic is limited or misrepresents the topic in reality.

#### **ASSIGNMENT**

In this assignment, you need to create a large-scale (16X20 or bigger) visual argument that makes a claim about your topic is presented in popular media and how those depictions are limited or inaccurate.

You will need to collect and/or create various images/depictions of your topic to determine how it is generally presented. Then, you will need to look for/create alternative perspectives and demonstrate how these perspectives expand how people can think about your topic.

Once you have collected your images, you'll need to design your visual argument. Your visual argument should make use of images, text, color, size, image placement, etc. to emphasize certain points and convey your general message about how your topic is generally presented in media and what that presentation omits and what you think is a more realistic presentation.

#### **FORMAT**

The visual part of your Perceptions & Reality: Sports, Entertainment & Technology project should be large-scale (poster or display-board size or larger). You can create a physical collage or you can use photo editing software to create a digital collage. Whichever method you choose, you must have a color display suitable for an exhibit which we will do as your Final Exam.
