## ASSIGNMENT

In this project, you will create a single web page, using HTML that you write yourself. Your webpage should be a profile of yourself and include things you like or are interested in. It can include hobbies, favorite movies, personal thoughts, etc. Since these are live on the Internet, please do not include any personal information you would not want others seeing.

## FORMAT

The page should be written in Notepad or TextEdit and saved as an .html file, following the instructions in the HTML lecture. The page must contain the following:

- A title tag to name your page
- 3 links
- 1 table
- 3 images
- At least 2 embedded pieces of outside media (videos, audios, etc.)

You must also use at least 5 of the tags from the HTML Elements References list on Moodle. These tags can be combined with the elements above. For example, you could use `<strong>` to bold words in your table.

Your goal is to help me get to know you, so you also need to think about organization of the content on the page and about aesthetics. The page should reflect your personality and tastes, but also be easy to see, read, and understand.
